

BRADSHAW GRAVE: #9

Three people are commemorated on this gravestone. These are **Frances BRADSHAW** died 28 Oct 1861 aged 62y; **Maria BRADSHAW** died 2 July 1869 aged 37y; **Thomas BRADSHAW** died 11 Mar 1877 aged 81y.

The Gravestone is brown-purple slate or shale with some white inclusions. In 2007 it was still upright if leaning towards the south and slightly backwards. The text is facing the Main Road

THE BRADSHAW FAMILY

The BRADSHAW family came to the Cape in 1850 as part of one of the Cape Government's Immigration plans. These were haphazard plans because during this period there were revolutions and wars in Europe as well as the immoral behaviour of settlers and crew onboard the *Gentoo*¹ These women were coming to marry Cape settlers. Many of the passenger lists are missing but that for the *Glentammer* arriving 13 Feb 1850 were found and contain a rather complex entry for BRADSHAWs²

This seems to imply that Thomas (jun), Charles, Philip BRADSHAW were unmarried adults aged between 26 and 21 years and so were listed separately while Thomas (sen) and his wife and the remaining four children (all under 21) came out as a group. [See below for all these family members histories]

THE BRADSHAW FAMILY IN THE UK

Thomas BRADSHAW

Born: calculated from DN – 1796. Quite a few “Thomas Bradshaws” were baptised in Northamptonshire and some with mother's name of Mary (the name of witness to Thomas Bradshaw's wedding, but this could also be a sister, not his mother)

Married: 1 May 1823 in parish church in Cottingham, Northants to **Frances SCULTHORPE**. He signed, she marked with an 'X'. witnesses: John Stokes and Mary Bradshaw. Frances's family history will be given below.

FRANCES BRADSHAW born SCULTHORPE

Someone has placed a history of the SCULTHORPE family on ancestry.com. Starting with John SCULTHORPE (b1675) and Sarah MURDOCK (also b1875). Their son, another John whose spouse is unknown, had at least two sons, Thomas (1721-1809) and Benjamin (1725-1767). Thomas was Frances Sculthorpe's grandfather. He married Ann PEAK and appeared to only have two children – Thomas (b1757) and John (b1759 who also died in 1759). Thomas SCULTHORPE (Frances's father) married Elizabeth BURKITT (1742-1816), Frances's mother. They, too seemed to have only two children. See illustration of the family tree below. Frances's birth has various dates calculated from different sources. Frances, together with her sister Rebecca, were baptised in Cottingham Parish Church on 7 Feb 1801. According to her gravestone in Rondebosch, she was 62 years old (Burial Register) on 28 Oct 1861 thus born 1799. Matters are made more complex by the 1841 Census giving the name Rebecca as Thomas BRADSHAW's wife.

Frances BRADSHAW accompanied her husband with all but one of their children to the Cape in 1850. Thomas became a woodcutter in the Newlands forest area and they seemed to attend St Saviour's Church but the grave in the St Paul's Churchyard commemorates Thomas and his first wife Frances and his second wife, Maria. (See below)

THE SCULTHORPE FAMILY TREE

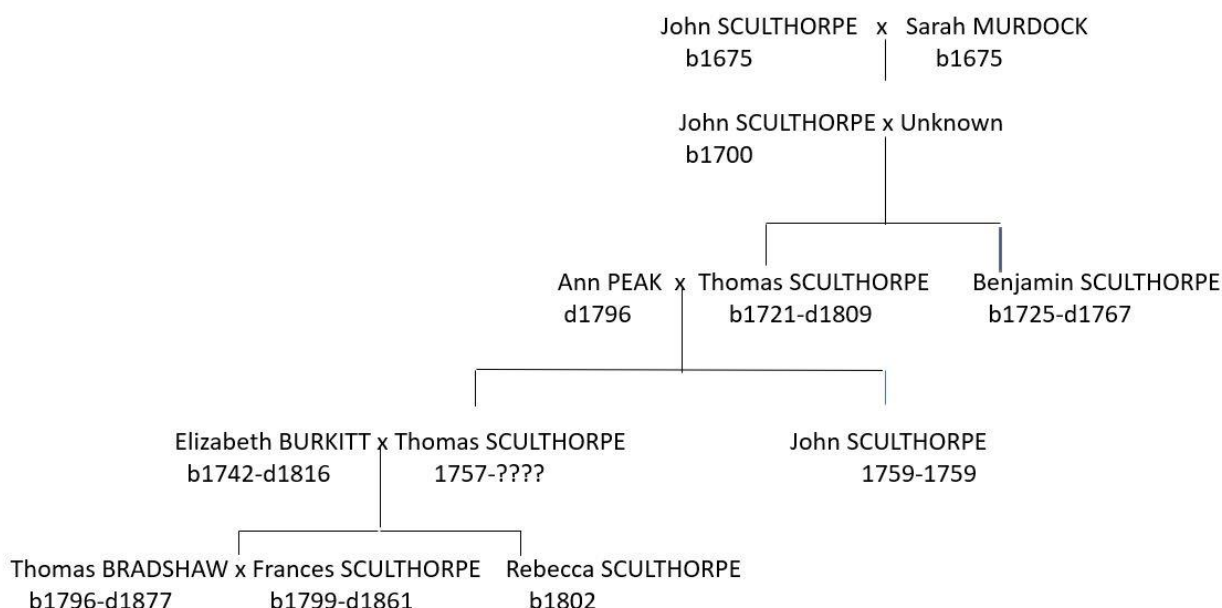


Fig. 1 The SCULTHORPE FAMILY TREE

Frances BRADSHAW born **SCULTHORPE** died 28 Oct 1861 and was buried 31 Oct 1861.

Thomas BRADSHAW marries again.

On 10 March 1863 **Thomas BRADSHAW** married **Maria MITCHELL** at St Saviour's, Claremont. Both Thomas and Maria were listed as widow/widower and of full age. Thomas Bradshaw was 67y and Maria was 31y. No DN could be found for any MITCHELLS who had a wife named Maria. Witness to the marriage were C Hobbs and Thomas's daughter, Elizabeth HOBBS.

Thomas BRADSHAW death.

Thomas BRADSHAW died in his home in Newlands on **11 Mar 1877**. He was buried in the St Paul's Graveyard on 13 Mar 1877 by the curate, The Rev R. C. Bailey. His DN filled in by son, Philip Bradshaw it states he was 81y while the Burial Register says he was 80y. He was a widower – his wife Frances and mother of all his children died in 1861 and his second wife, Maria born MITCHELL died in 1869. The children listed on his DN included John, Charles, Philip, James, Mary (married to William James HOUNDSOME) and Elizabeth (married to George HOUNDSOME) and Caroline. Under the question whether the deceased had left any property and of what kind, Philip states: "Landed property in Claremont." The DN was filed at the Master's Office on 3rd April.

Thomas BRADSHAW's WILL

Also filed on 3rd April but made out in 1876:

[Filed 3 April 1877]

In the Name of God. Amen.

Be it hereby made known unto all whom it shall or may concern, that on this twelfth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand and eight hundred and seventy-six, in the presence of the subscribed witnesses personally came and appeared Thomas Bradshaw of Claremont of the Wynberg District

And the said appearee being in health of body and sound and disposing mind memory and understanding as appeared at the passing of these present, declared his intention to make and declare his last will and testament;

wherefore hereby revoking and annulling all wills, codicils and other testamentary acts heretofore made and passed by him.

And the said appearee declared to nominate and appoint the following of his children viz:- John Bradshaw now in England, Charles Bradshaw, Philip Bradshaw and his daughters Mary married to James Hounsom. Elizabeth married to George Hounsom and Caroline married to Nicholas Carls, with grandson Philip the son of Thomas Bradshaw, deceased, to be sole and universal heirs, in equal portions, share and share alike, of all the estate, goods, effects, stock inheritances legacies, chattels, credits and things whatsoever and wheresoever the same may be, which shall be left at...

... at his death, whether moveable or immoveable and of what nature or kind so ever whether the same be in possession reversion, remainders or expectancy and nothing excepted.

And the said appearee further declares to nominate and appoint Samuel Larkin to be the executor of this his will and administrator of his estate and effects, hereby giving an granting unto him all such power and authority as are required or allowed in law and especially those of assumption substitution and surrogation.

Lastly the appearee declared to secure to himself the power from time to time and at all times hereafter to make and alterations in addition to this will, as he shall think fit either by a separate act or at the foot hereof, desiring that all such alterations or additions to be made under his own signature and shall be held as valid and effectual as if they had been inserted herein.

All which having been clearly and distinctly read over to the testator be declared that he fully understood the same and that its contains his last will and testament desiring that it may have effect as such or as a codicil or otherwise in such manner as may be found to consist with law

This done and passed at Cape Town the day, month and year aforesaid in the presence of witnesses Mainsell Andrew Blunden and George Clegg

Census 1841

The Bradshaw family were still living in Cottingham, Northamptonshire in 1841 when the first National Census took place. The method of data collection was simplistic and crude. Adult ages were given to the nearest five years, place of birth was merely whether they were born in the County or not and occupation simply entered. Thomas BRADSHAW was defined as being "Ag. Lab." Agricultural labourer.

In the 1878 Cape Colony Voters Roll for Western Cape shows all the male members of the BRADSHAW family on the Newlands Field-Cornetcy List.

By 1878, both Thomas BRADSHAW, jun. and Thomas BRADSHAW, Sen. had already died. In spite of being only a woodcutter and Thomas jun. a shoemaker, Thomas Bradshaw's DN states, he owned property and so he qualified as a voter. The sons must have had similar qualifications.

The **Cape Qualified Franchise** first appeared in 1853, when the Cape Colony received representative government and elected its first parliament. This was done without regard to race, and a non-racial voters roll became part of the Cape's 1853 Constitution. Many powerful members of the Cape's political elite in the 1850s, leaders such as John Fairbairn, Saul Solomon, John Molteno and William Porter, genuinely seemed to believe that it was the only fair way to run a society, and that racial distinctions counted as unjust discrimination.

When queried by worried white voters on the issue of black citizens voting, William Porter, the Cape attorney-general famously responded:

Why should you fear the exercise of franchise? This is a delicate question but it must be touched upon. I do not hesitate to say that I would rather meet the Hottentot at the hustings, voting for his representative, than in the wilds with his gun upon his shoulder. Is it not better to disarm them by granting them the privileges of the constitution? If you now blast all their hopes and tell them they shall not fight their battles constitutionally, do not you yourselves apply to them the stimulus to fight their battles unconstitutionally? (quoted in Simons and Simons, 1983: 23)

A minimum property ownership of £25 qualified the male Cape citizen to vote or to stand in parliament. As this included all forms of property ownership, including traditional African communal land tenure, it was very low, relative to the suffrage qualifications that applied elsewhere in the world at the time. In fact, it was widely considered to be excessively low, and there were several political movements that tried to have it raised. The system was known as the "£25 vote". Decades later, literacy was added as an additional criterion to qualify for suffrage. The existence of voter qualifications was a standard feature of early democracies, and women's suffrage was virtually unknown in the world at the time. However while the Cape shared these restrictive features, its explicitly colour-blind political system was unusually inclusive. ³

In Jun Q 1869, Elizabeth BRADSHAW born BEESWORTH, John's wife died.

In Dec Q 1869, son Charles Bradshaw married Sarah Ann PALMER. They had four children two sons, two daughters) before Charles died in 1879 aged 31y.

The 1871 Census finds the family has now grown by a further son, George born in 1862. Also staying the family is one of Charles' daughters, Elizabeth Ann BRADSHAW.

By the 1881 Census on John Bradshaw and youngest son, George are still at home.

Thomas BRADSHAW had married **Elizabeth Allen** in Sep Q 1875 in Billesdon, Leicester. They had a total of eight children. The first three died young but the remainder survived childhood.

Fanny Elizabeth BRADSHAW married Edmund BULL (1850-1906) in Cottingham in 1878. She died in 1924.

James BRADSHAW in the 1881 Census appears as a Carter in Ashton-under-Lyme, where he was lodging. He later married Mary Ashton and had four daughters.

John BRADSHAW jun. married Anne Elizabeth TANSLEY in 1878 and they had six children

Census 1841 Thomas jun. was living at home with parents and sibling in the 1841 census. See above list above.

Immigration: Thomas BRADSHAW jun. immigrated to the Cape Colony with the rest of the family in 1850. He became a shoe/boot maker in Claremont. See above for immigration record.

First Marriage:

On 12 Jan 1856 in the temp. Roman Catholic Chapel in Rondebosch Thomas jun. married Mary REDDAN b 1825. Mary BRADSHAW born REDDAN died on 7 May 1860. Her Death Notice states she was 35y of age, born in County Clare, Ireland to Michael Reddan and Catherine Reddan born Ratchford. She died "at her home, Claremont". Although the form has "Mary Reddan" at the top, it says she was the wife of Thomas BRADSHAW and it also says they had no children. Under property it states that she had "moveable and immoveable property" A will was submitted and must still be checked:

The Death Notice was signed with a "X" – and a comment "Mark of Patrick Reddan. Witness P. D. Holmes". Patrick was a cab driver who lived in Buitenkant Street and died in 1872. Unusual that husband did not sign DN. Was he so upset or unable to write so left it to her brother or were they separated?

Second Marriage

On 14 May 1861 Thomas BRADSHAW junior married for a second time to Bridget RYAN. Thomas BRADSHAW is listed as a widower and Bridget RYAN as a spinster. The Marriage Register states they were married at St Mary's Cape Town. This is most probably St Mary Catholic Church especially as the minister marrying them is M. O'Reilly. Witnesses were Philip BRADSHAW, Thomas's brother and Margaret O'Grady. None of the marriage party (bride, groom or witnesses were able to write and they all signed the register with "X"

I have tried to calculate Bridget RYAN's age from her Death Registration form but it is difficult to read with any certainty. It looks like her age in 1900 was "Ninetysevenyears"[sic] but that would make born 1803 and over 20 years old than her husband. At her marriage she is "full age" so over 21 years so minimum DoB 1840. Husband, Thomas was born 1825 and 36 years when he married and Bridget would be most probably similar age, so most probably born between 1823 to 1833 or up to 1840. Although Death Registration found, no Death Notice could be found to conform Bridget RYAN's year of birth.

Children from the Marriage of Thomas BRADSHAW jun. and BRIDGET born RYAN

Two children with Thomas and Bridget as parents were found being baptised at St Saviour's Claremont.

1. On 29 Jan 1862 a son, **Philip BRADSHAW** was born. He was baptised at St Saviours on 7th February. There are no witnesses given in the register because it was a private baptism implying that Philip must have been ill.

On 21 Jun 1903 a Philip BRADSHAW died at Victoria Cottage Hospital Wynberg. The Civil Death Registration is frustratingly not very informative. It gives age as 46y which means born 1857 (he was born 7 year later in 1864). Next to marital status is says 'Unknown'. Occupation says 'Blacksmith(?)'. He died of apoplexy. Perhaps he was a 'down-and-out' person and little was know about him and so buried in a paupers cemetery. No other Death Notice or Registration for a Philp BRADSHAW found in SA records.

2. On 14 Sep 1864, a daughter **Bridget BRADSHAW** was born. She was baptised 7 Feb 1864. Once again no witnesses are given.

On 9 Jun 1865 **Bridget BRADSHAW** aged nearly 2y died and was buried at St Saviours.

Death of Thomas BRADSHAW

Thomas BRADSHAW sen. states in his Will that his son, Thomas was deceased and his grandson, Philip, son of Thomas jun. should receive Thomas's share in the estate. Thomas BRADSHAW jun. is not listed on his father's DN. As he died before Civil Registration of Death and perhaps as he had no Estate to speak of no Death Notice was found, nor any burial at St Saviour's or St Paul's where his mother and step mother were buried. It must be presumed that Thomas BRADSHAW died between 1864 (Birth of his son Philip) and 1876 (shen the will of Thomas sen. was written).

Bridget BRADSHAW born RYAN

Bridget BRADSHAW born **RYAN** died on 8 Apr 1900 in her house in Vineyard road, Claremont. Her age could not be clearly read. She died of influenza and asthma. The form was filled in by what could either be T or J BRADSHAW who was “present at death” and who lived in Glynn Terrace Cape Town but the 1900 Street Director has no BRADSHAW’s living there. Was it James and he died?

Although NAAIRS gives a reference to a Liquidation and Distribution Accounts File, no MOOC 6/9/xxx containing a Death Notice was found.

Immigration

Charles BRADSHAW came with the family to the Cape Colony in 1850 on board the *Glentammer*. See above. Charles BRADSHAW was aged about 23 years.

Died unmarried:

Charles BRADSHAW died 4 Nov 1882 in his 53rd year at Newlands. His father had died 5 years before and his mother eleven years before. He was buried from St Paul’s Church on 5th Nov 1882. His Death Notice tells us that he was a woodcutter like his father. His brother Philip BRADSHAW (see below) filled in the form and lists under property left states that he had left ‘two cottages and some ready money’.

Mary was at home with her family for the Census 1841. There is a discrepancy in ages. She should be 10y but the Census gives her age as 4y. See above for Census 1841 records.

Immigration

Like the others of her family she came to the Cape Colony on the *Glentammer* in 1850.

Married:

James William (or William James) HOUNDSOME 21 Nov 1859 St Saviour's Claremont. Both names (James William or William James) are used.

Children: None specifically found but there was a Thomas Bradshaw HOUNDSOME born in 1876 who died in 1956.

Died: Mary BRADSHAW died on 5 Feb 1878. She was buried in St Saviour's, Claremont as was Henrietta HOUNDSOME (? William James HOUNDSOME's sister or perhaps a second wife). William James HOUNSOME died 23 Jan 1920. He was aged 82y so thus born 1838. He was a shoemaker from Wynberg.

George HOUNDSOME on 12 Aug 1863. Elizabeth was 19y. George was a shoemaker from Kirstenbosch aged 24y. Witnesses were Thomas BRADSHAW, Caroline BRADSHAW (with a 'X') and Martha HOUNDSOME.

1. **Elizabeth HOUNDSOME** born 20 Oct 1864 Bapt 23 Nov 1864 St Saviours. Godparents: Caroline BRADSHAW, Mary Ann HOUNDSOME and Charles BRADSHAW. According to Death Reg 1847 and 1846 according to Marriage Certificate. It does not appear that Caroline's birth was registered in the UK.

Baptism: Nor was she baptised at Cottingham Parish Church.

Immigration: Among the 'four children' when Thomas and Francis BRADSHAW came to the Cape.

Married: On Thomas BRADSHAW's Will it states that Caroline is married to **Nicholas CARLS**. A marriage Certificate for **Caroline BRADSHAW** and **Klaas CARL** married on 1 Aug 1865 at St Paul's Church Rondebosch. Claas is an abbreviation of Nicholas. He was 20y and a servant. Caroline was 19y. Witnesses: X for John CARLS and a signature from Jessie GOMES.

Caroline CARLS (b post 1865 before 1871 d. 14 Sep 1918). m. 30 Dec 1899 to Joseph RANDACCIO (1872 or 1874 - 1926). On Marriage Certificate he is a painter on his Death Notice he is a 'Professor of Music'. In his will he states that his stepson, William Glover, his stepson should be his executor. On the marriage certificate Joseph is listed as

⁴ A Death Registration has been found for Caroline CARLS born BRADSHAW in Kimberley. She was living at 24a Selby Street. In 1899 a Caroline CARLS married a Joseph RANDACCIO. When RANDACCIO died in 1926 they were living at 24a Selby Street Kimberley. I am therefore concluding that CAROLINE RANDACCIO born CARLS is a daughter of Nicholas and Caroline CARLS born BRADSHAW.]

Bachelor and Caroline CARL is listed as a spinster. RANDACCIO's DN is signed by 'William Carls GLOVER'. Caroline CARLS had a child, William (born 27 Feb 1896) before her marriage to Joseph. William CARLS was baptised at St Cyprians 11 Aug 1896 and he had two nuns, Sister Carol and Sister Mary CSM&AA as godparents. William Carls GLOVER died in Natal in 1959. Presumably GLOVER is the surname of his father.

Death of Caroline CARLS born BRADSHAW

On 14 Sep 1918 Caroline CARLS born BRADSHAW died at 24 Selby Street Kimberley. She was 71y and died of diabetes. She is listed as a widow but I found no Death Registration or Death Notice for Nicholas or Claas CARLS.
